Basketball Academy members were put through their paces in term 1, focusing on fundamentals and fitness during trainning sessions. Our junior teams were also competing in the interschool basketball competition during sport sessions (see the junior and middle school report for results).

will see our junior and senior teams playing
in the Southside Premier League (SPL). A
great competition which allows our students
to play other Basketball specialist schools

such as Citipionte Christian College,
Marsden SHS and Brisbane Adventist
College to name a few. Last year both
our junior males and females made it
to the final four, with our girls team
going on to claim the silver medal.

Term 3 and 4 our Junior, Sophomore and Open teams will compete at the Champion Basketball Schools of QLD (CBSQ) tournament. The highest level of school basketball offered in QLD. Alexandra Hills SHS has a great history in this competition winning a gold, three silvers and a bronze. We will be looking to add more medals this year!



The year 7 & 8 teams have started the year well with our year 7 boys and year 8 girls claiming a spot in the interschool grand final, to be played on April 18th.

The year 7 girls finished the interschool competition in 3^{rd} position just missing out on a spot in the grand final. While our year 8 boys finished in a tie for 2^{nd} place. However missed out on making the grand final due to a count back on scores.

Off the court our year 7 students learnt about our Basketball Academy culture and motto 'Run As One'. They also learnt about the physical, social and emotional changes people go through during adolescence.

years Met. East Basketball trials. They represented Alexandra Hills SHS extremely well on the day!


At the club representative level, we have

SOUTHSIDE PREMIER LEAGUE Results & Update

Each school must enter four teams in the competition. A senior boys and girls, which contains players from year 10-12. The junior boys and girls involve players from year 7-9.

This year the competition runs in term two, from weeks 1-7. With the finals being played in week 8 and 9. This competition is a great way to prepare for the state titles held later in the year.

Given the layout of combined year levels making up the teams for this competition, students have to gain selection to play. Teams may change for each round, this means teams will be announced on a weekly basis.

We look forward to competing this year and hope to see our teams feature in the finals.

What is new in 2023?

Each year the Basketball Academy looks to improve outcomes for our players, families and basketball community. This year we have added to our Basketball Academy staff, employing Gareth Lyle. A previous students and Alexandra Hills SHS Basketball Academy player. He is also a part of the RedCity Roar NBL1 Men's team. time will be allocated to analyzing particular points of focus. This will allow students to be prepared mentally going into each game.
