Building A Successful Culture 'Run As One'

Term 2 was another exciting and eventful term for the Basketball Academy! Our teams enjoyed specialists training sessions, we had the start of the senior boys and girls interschool season, preparations for 2022's year 7 Basketball Academy students began and we were excited to join the inaugural Southside Premier League (SPL) – an invitational comptetion for select schools.

All ten teams have been training hard and demonstrating the Basketball Academy philosophy: 'Run as One'. On the court, this means being a great teammate by creating space with or without the ball, running together and being an option for your team mates. Off the court, our students always demonstrate their support for one another by encouraging each other and sharing in each individual's success. It is also great to see teams supporting one another during competitions.





Our year 7 students have been busy testing their basketball specific fitness during class. Fitness tests have include the beep test (endurance), one handed tennis ball toss (hand and eye coordination), the court sprint (speed), vertical leap (power) and the agility test.

It has been great to see the encouragement and support amongst our year 7 group. While students are pushing themselves against each other, they still share in one another's successes. There were some great results across the board, however a special mention has to go to Sam and Brianna who recorded an 11.5 and 10.5 on the beep test respectively.



BASKETBALL ACADEMY FITNESS TESTING

Our year 8 students focused on skill development throughout term 2. This involved players developing a range of offensive attacking options and working together on the defensive end.

After winning the interschool competition the year 8 boys advanced into the metro finals. They travelled to Corinda SHS and played in what was a very competitive game. There were numerous highlights throughout the game, including a great defensive effort from Matthew. Unfortunately, the team went down by 2 points in the final moments of the game.













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After our year 9 and 10 girls teams finished in the top 4 of the interschool competition last term, focus quickly shifted to the SPL and CSBQ competitions.

The **Year 9 girls** who are a part of the Junior SPL team have made a great start to this competition, taking out wins against Wellington Point SHS and Runcorn SHS. These results have placed the girls in the top 4 during the early stages of the competition.

The **Year 10 girls** who are competing in the Senior SPL team have made great progress in their skills and gameplay. While these girls are currently competing as the youngest team in the competition they are playing hard and their commitment will pay off in the upcoming rounds.

These girls were also fortunate enough to be involved in a specialist training session with **NBL1 RedCity Roar** Player Ash Kelman-Poto. Ash is a very experienced basketball player who has applied her trade throughout New Zealand, recently being named in the Tall Ferns squad

(international New Zealand Basketball Team). More recently she has been representing the RedCity roar in their inaugural NBL1 season.



The Year 9 Boys continued on their impressive winning streak, beating Corinda SHS, Wavell SHS and Dakabin SHS on their way to the 'Metro. Grand Final'. In what was a very fast paced game, we eventually went down to Trinity College with only 5 points separating the teams. The boys also received praise from the officials on the day for their respect and sportsmanship.
